SUPPLEMENTAL BRIEF FOR PETITIONER

This Supplemental Brief is to advise the Court about the Court of Appeals for

the Fourth Circuit's published decision in In re Hubbard, No. 15-276 (4th Cir., June

8, 2016). In Hubbard, the court held the rule from Johnson v. United States, 135 S.

Ct. 2551 (2015), retroactively applicable in Guidelines cases on collateral review

because Johnson alters "the 'substantive reach' of the Sentencing Guidelines[,]" in

that "some crimes will no longer fit the Sentencing Guidelines' definition of a crime

of violence and will therefore be incapable of resulting in a career-offender sentencing

enhancement." Hubbard, No. 15-276, at 19-20 (quoting Welch v. United States, 136

S. Ct. 1257, 1265 (2016)).

Hubbard deepens the post-Welch circuit conflict regarding whether Johnson is

retroactive to guidelines cases on collateral review, and further demonstrates the

need for this Court's immediate guidance. See Reply to Brief in Opposition at 9-10;

Supplemental Brief for Petitioner at 1-2.
